



# MOVING WITH OUR EXTERNAL DISCIPLINES TO FIND AN INTERNAL AWARENESS

## WEEK ONE: THE DESERT

As we begin week one, the season of Lent draws us into a richness of depth. We see our Savior, Jesus, tempted. We see the tension between what is happening to Him externally in the desert for forty days to His finding the inner strength to fight the temptation, not with just external strength but with an awareness that comes from a spiritual force that is divine. When the temptation is hunger, Jesus pushes through the excruciating hunger pain to say there is another place to feed, another place that can refresh that is not of this world. When tempted by the devil with regards to power, once again seeing all the kingdoms of the world, Jesus fights back with an inner awareness that only the Lord our God should be worshipped and that kind of power is different from the world's interpretation of it. What is seen is the true saving power of God internally manifested through acknowledgment and worship of the only One who we are called to serve. The third temptation involves the revelation of Jesus as the Son of God. The devil wants to tempt Jesus to throw Himself down in order to give evil the proof it desires on evil's terms. Jesus once again draws inner strength from Scripture to refute the devil.

All of this is a template. We are invited to make sure we come out of the desert of Lent relying on the correct things. We are invited to make sure all the Lenten observations we are experiencing externally are connected and integrated to bring us into a deeper internal awareness of the goodness of God. We need to be giving up things, but also adding works of charity. We need to be praying more, reading more Scripture, we need to attend Stations, and to make it to church more often. All the disciplines of our bodies and our time are to lead us to a new depth. This new depth is to drive us to an awareness of the one true God and all that He is wanting to reveal to us. We are to reach Holy Week stronger, more alive, and more convinced of the goodness of God. The experiences are to lead us to that which is internal. Seek to connect, seek to become aware, seek to know the depth and breadth of God.

Week one invites us to make sure our map is correct and our compass coordinated and set. Run to the desert, discipline the body, but be sure to connect it to where it leads. Discipline for the sake of discipline is just discipline. When it builds an awareness of God, it brings a force that leads us to eternity.

## LENT AND PASCHAL TRIDUUM GUIDELINES

### Fast and Abstinence Regulations

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on **Ash Wednesday** and all the **Fridays of Lent**.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**.
3. On **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.



### Family Scripture Connection

There are many temptations around us every day. Some are small (should I eat that second cookie?) and some are big (should I cheat on my math test?). Sometimes it is really hard to say “no” to temptations, even when we know something is wrong. Luckily, we do not have to resist temptation all on our own! Every time we pray the Lord’s Prayer (Our Father), we ask God to “lead us not into temptation.” And we know from the Gospel story for this 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent that God, through His Son Jesus, knows what it is like to be tempted. Like Jesus, we can reach out to God in prayer and ask for help any time we face temptation. And if we rely on God, we will have the strength and wisdom to make the right choices.

### Tug of war?

During this Lent, be mindful about the reasons you pull away from doing the right thing, and what (or who) tempts you to do the wrong thing. From the days of the Old Testament when the commandments were gifted up through today, all humans are tempted and struggle to live out: “*You shall worship the Lord, your God, and Him alone shall you serve.*” When God is placed 1<sup>st</sup> in our life, temptation doesn’t go away, but more strength is given! While Jesus is God, He was human and understand the tug of war in our hearts and minds.

**DASH 1:** Welcome back 5:45 classes! 4:30 groups, check FlipGrid for your work this week (or whatever Ms. Julie might have given in class last week.)

**DASH 2:** This week please complete Catholicism 101 modules 11 – 15 (which includes items about Lent). I will see everyone again **next week**, **Sunday March 13 from 4:30 – 6:30 PM** for Reconciliation and some group time. And then again Thursday, March 17 or Sunday, March 20.

**DASH 3:** Tonight (Sunday, **March 6** or Thursday, **March 10**) begins a deeper conversation about Confirmation, the Holy Spirit, and connections to your life. *This group also comes next week, Sunday, March 13 from 4:30 – 6:30 PM for Reconciliation.* After that, we don’t meet in person until May! This whole year has been a “workout” for you to be strong and own your faith journey and choices. During Lent you are put to the test to keep up your prayer life with minimal reminders while calling on your Saint as you write the report on them.





Hi everybody,

Are you ready for a little Spring? Are you ready for a little easing of tensions and relief? The Poet once said, "If Winter's here can Spring be far behind?" and I would like to add to that, "If, indeed, please God, our modern plague is beginning to dissipate, can celebration and thanksgiving be far behind? I would like to invite you to some serious celebration and thanksgiving.



From September 5 to 15 of this year, I, along with Fr. Scott Huggins and Fr. Agustin Ortega (three priests, no waiting) will be leading a pilgrimage to Oberammergau in Germany to experience their wonderful Passion Play. The people of the village promised that if they could get through the bubonic plague they would celebrate by re-creating Christ's Passion every 10 years. And from 1635 to the present, they have not failed. They now invite us all to attend.

Father Scott is the "official" host of the pilgrimage and we will be traveling with him as we experience Heidelberg, the Rhine Valley, Lucerne, Innsbrook, Salzburg, Altotting, Markt Am Inn, Munich and Rothenburg. And the crown jewel will be our stay in Oberammergau at the Passion Play.

The cost will be \$4379 per person from Chicago. The tour will include round-trip airfare from Chicago, accommodations at first class select hotels, first class admission to the passion play, most meals, professional English-speaking tour directors and travel by a private motor coach.


