I am a visual person, inspired often by what I see. In my room every morning I look at the corpus of the crucified Savior from my first trip to Africa. It is not attached to a cross, because every day I know I must carry the cross with Him. In the bathroom are three pictures from three different golf courses. The first is a gorgeous shot of looking forward at the green with the flag surrounded by clouds in Waterville, Ireland. It is a reminder to make good decisions while looking forward to where you are going. The second is a picture of my golf bag on a famous bridge at St. Andrews in Scotland. It is to challenge me to stay in the moment, not consumed by looking forward or looking back, realizing that the present moment has a purpose. The third and final picture is of a shot of a par-three hole looking back from behind the green. It is looking back at where I had been on the course. It is from Bandon Dunes, Oregon. It is a calling to remember where I started. It is a look back to see where the journey has taken me, the hills I've climbed, and the hazards I may or may not have missed.

These three pictures are my visual reminder as to how I am to embrace the day open to God and His plan in my life. I am to look forward, stay present, and always reflect on the past to find wisdom. His plan brought me here nine years ago. Back then I looked forward to an opportunity to bring sacramental grace to you that was centered in the Eucharist. With the help of our dedicated staff, we marched together finding new ways to celebrate the Lord Jesus. The Triduum found renewal and the environment always changing, hopefully becoming a doorway to help us to focus. Volunteers blended vision with talent and the glory of God was praised.

The present found us on a very new and defining bridge. We had to live in a time of a pandemic. New committees had to be formed, and restrictions for safety became the loudest voice. In those moments, isolation and fear seemed to challenge the core of who we were called to become. Faith never left. God never abandoned us. All of you are a powerful testimony to that. Looking back at where we have come, I feel so blessed to have journeyed with you. From mission trips to the creation of a St. Vincent de Paul Society, from vibrant Parish Councils and Commissions to a great Reunite in Christ weekend, I have seen the fingerprint of God in all of it. Thank you for sharing so proudly the truth of Jesus Christ. Thank you for inspiring me to experience more profoundly the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Thank you for forgiving me for the times when I did not listen intently, the times when I got distracted or was abrupt. I am an imperfect vessel trying to humbly walk with the Lord and I mess that up from time to time.

St. Paul writes that there are three things that remain: faith, hope, and love, and the greatest of these is love. Know of my love for all of you and the profound impact you have had and will continue to have in my life.

As the journey continues, may it find us in prayer for one another,

HOPE DOES NOT DISAPPOINT

Today our lives are invited into the love dynamic of the Most Holy Trinity. It is a union beyond description, a unity unparalleled and enfolded in mystery. In the profound wisdom of the Creator/Father, the Son came to save us with a divine sacrifice like no other. His promise lives on sparked by the Holy Spirit that prompts our minds and fills our hearts. On this Solemnity, we are to gaze into the mystery and allow the mystery to gaze back at us.

In the Second Reading today Paul in his Letter to the Romans speaks of hope. Hope does not disappoint. We all begin new projects with hope; every baseball and football season begins with hope. Every time I go out to golf, I start out with hope. Sometimes the hope is just to be able to find my ball. Yet hope seems to dissipate and reality sets in. Sports teams underachieve, golf balls go in the water, and we don't accomplish everything we hoped to do. Yet hope does not disappoint. How does that happen? We live in a world torn apart, polarized and divided. Gun violence, hatred, and battle lines are drawn up by the minute. The weapons of words fail to find the truth. Where is this hope? I see pain and destruction, suffering and hardship. How can hope prevail?

The answer is found in the next line Paul wrote. "...because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts." God is doing the pouring. His love is the power of hope. We are to invite this hope into our hearts and into our whole being. We are to trust the Holy Spirit so completely that we allow the love dynamic of the entire Most Holy Trinity to become the foundation of our lives. With this love, we can walk into this world, and even though we suffer, we know we will be given the endurance to embrace it as it is meant to be.

The impact of the Most Holy Trinity is found in the pouring of love into our hearts. It is realizing we are a vessel, a receptacle. Divine Love is longing to fill us. Love that is creative yet pained, insightful yet demanding. It is mysterious and cannot be controlled. Can we open ourselves to that kind of trust?

May this love be poured into us always,



How Can We Thank You?

June 2019, *Christ is our Hope*

At the time of my ordination on June 7, 1958, little did I realize the love, support, care and friendship of so many Catholic parishioners in the parishes I have served throughout the Diocese of Joliet.

Now after 61 years of priesthood, I still love my ministry, and I thank God that I am able to serve in the Joliet area. When I visit our young priests, I tell them how blessed they should be to touch the hearts and souls of so many of God's people.

I continue to be convinced of the prayers of so many people for their priests, present and former parishioners, religious men and women, retired and infirm priests, parish shut-ins and (the list could go on), sustaining both active and those of us in the senior-priest category (far from retired).

Hopefully, all our priests remain committed to caring for the elderly and infirm, for one day we will likely be in the same position.

As a priest ages, like all of us, we too often need care and special attention. We have retired and senior priests living at St. John Vianney Villa in Naperville and Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home in Joliet. There are also senior priests living on their own. I might add that our St. John Vianney Villa is home to nine priests and is capably administered by the Oblates of the Sacred Heart. We are indeed blessed to have Sister Teresina and Sister Karen Marie making the villa a home for our retired priests.

A significant number of our senior priests assist on a regular basis in parishes celebrating Masses, hearing confessions and filling in on a temporary basis. The assistance also enables priests serving in our parishes to take their vacations and occasionally get away for a little rest and relaxation. Father Dan Stempora, Father Marty Gabel, and Father Tony


Taschetta are out on ministry assignments almost daily, while others fill in as needed. Father Bill O'Shea lives in Chicago and assists at Old St. Patrick's Church and returns often to teach religion at All Saints Catholic Academy in Naperville. Father Charlie Wheeler lives at Ss. Mary & Joseph in Chebanese and is ministering on a daily basis in the Kankakee region. I am blessed to assist at several parishes in Joliet, as well as offering Mass at several retirement and nursing homes in the area.

However, to maintain a quality of life in our "golden" years is where we rely on your continued generous financial help. Your senior priests are well aware of the rising costs of medical care and the ordinary living expenses.

The Father's Day Collection taken up each June for the Fund for Diocesan Infirm and Elderly Priests is to meet the needs of our diocesan elderly, infirmed and retired priests. This year, that collection will take place at parishes throughout the diocese on Father's Day weekend, June 18-19.

Old age, senior status or whatever you want to call it, is a graced time to encounter God in new and wonderful ways. As we senior priests have more time for prayer, silence and stillness, you – our faithful and loving parishioners of the Diocese of Joliet – are remembered daily in our Masses and other prayers. As we have tried to be Good Shepherds to you over many years, we now appreciate your continued care and financial generosity as we draw closer to the promised reward for all those who have loved and served our God.

All of our senior priests express their deep appreciation and sincere gratitude for your love and tremendous generosity. †





NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

Next Sunday we begin the National Eucharistic Revival as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The next three years will offer opportunities for catechesis, prayer and service as a Diocese, as Parishes and as individuals to empower a deepening of our relationship with Christ present in the Eucharist.

Bishop Hicks will open the Diocesan Eucharistic Revival Sunday June 19 at the Cathedral of St. Raymond Nonnatus in Joliet during the 10:30 AM Mass. At the end of the Mass Bishop Hicks will lead a Eucharistic Procession around the block on which the Cathedral stands. During the Procession we will briefly stop for prayers and hymns. The Procession will conclude at the Cathedral with Benediction. We encourage people to attend this Mass or to come around 11:30 and stand on the sidewalks around the Cathedral to silently pray as the Eucharist is carried in this procession or to join the procession as it exits the Cathedral. There will be extra parking available at the University of St. Francis off of Douglas Street.

(Note: If it rains, the Eucharistic Procession will take place within the Cathedral.)



Family Scripture Connection

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. What does this mean? A Solemnity is the highest ranking (most important) type of feast day we celebrate in the Catholic Church. "Most Holy" means the most perfect in goodness, love, and all things sacred. Trinity comes from the words "tri" (meaning three) and "unity" (meaning being joined together as a whole). The three persons of the Trinity - God the Father, God the Son (Jesus), and God the Holy Spirit - are united as ONE complete God! This all means that on this very important day, we celebrate that the Trinity is most deserving of our respect, love, and devotion. How can we honor the Trinity? By doing our best to follow God's example! How can you speak the truth, live in peace, and love/serve others this week?
