This is something that the Catholic Church has always held to be true. Too often people nowadays believe that the Church stifles learning both now and in the past. However, most of those people assume that his experimental work was tolerated at best in the monastery and the Church at large. The truth is his work was encouraged as learning more about God's creation and for the betterment of mankind.

And that should be the goal of everyone of us whether we are currently in school (from pre-school to college) or not. We should seek out opportunities to learn more about the universe around us both to understand more about God it's creator and to aid in the advancement and improvement of our fellow human beings. - Members are not required to be at every Mass or rehearsal. Come share you love of singing and learn more about the music of our worship.

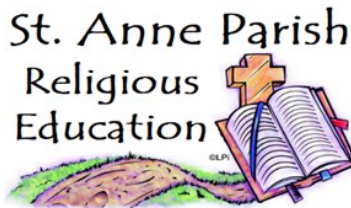

Family Scripture Connection

The Gospel for this 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time reminds us that being a follower of Jesus is hard work! It is not enough to just say we are Catholic or that we love Jesus. If we want to be with Him in heaven someday, we have to make wise choices about how we live, what we say, and what we do. Think of the old saying WWJD (What Would Jesus Do?). That's what we need to do as well – pray (with the community at Mass and on our own); learn about the faith; help others; follow the Commandments. It's not easy, but it is very worth the hard work!



WWJD: What Would Jesus Do?

When I have asked the question: "who likes rules" to youth, the majority say no way! They want to do what they want, when they want, and their way. But rules are present to help us grow in the right direction and that's the same thing for our faith/religion (and why many people struggle with religion, too.) In a roundabout way, today's readings speak to that side of religion, because usually we don't receive discipline unless we aren't following what we should do. *This coming year, as we go back to more "normal" times for DASH, know that requirements are present to help teens learn and grow into their own faith journey. May they be open and ready!*

Parent/Teen/Sponsor Meeting for those in DASH 3: For those registered, a sign-up link was sent to choose either Sunday, September 11 from 4:00 – 6:00 PM **or** Thursday, September 15 from 7:00 - 9:00 PM. What does this logo mean? Each Confirmation group hears about it as it was created for them. At Baptism (the cross-like hashtag) the Holy Spirit is "N US" and we are fed by the Eucharist. Confirmation completes the Sacraments of Initiation, and I wanted them to connect the dots. The Confirmation liturgy is not until November. 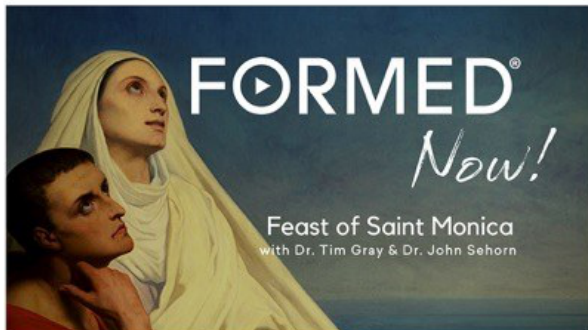

FORMED NOW: THE FEAST OF SAINT MONICA



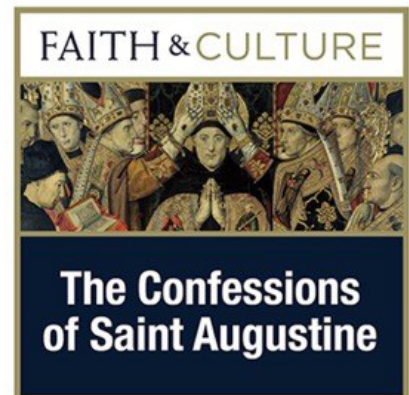
Throughout her life, St. Monica constantly prayed for the conversion of Augustine, her beloved son.
