A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

Next weekend (November 12-13) our parish will welcome Colin McGarel, a seminarian preparing for the priesthood for our diocese. He will be speaking at all the Masses that weekend about his call to the priesthood and his current life as a man preparing to minister to the people of the Diocese of Joliet. I hope that you will all give him a warm welcome.

Not by coincidence we will also be taking up a Second Collection the weekend of November 12-13 in support of the new diocesan seminary fund called "I will give you shepherds." The second collection has a very simple reason for its existence and purpose. As Catholics, we hold that God especially and most definitively makes known to us His mercy and grace through the Sacraments of the Church. These Sacraments (particularly Reconciliation and the Eucharist) are brought to the people of God from God through the priests of the Church. In short, we need priests to bring the Sacraments of the Church to all of God's people. However, the Church cannot just call any man a priest and call it ok. The priesthood is a calling from God that is confirmed by the Church here on earth. A Catholic priest is expected to be dedicated to living his life in the manner of Jesus Christ. The only real way to determine whether a man is able and willing to live his life in this manner is through preparation and practice. A priest needs to be able to explain the Teaching of the Church to other people and to do that he must first learn what that teaching is and how to explain it to others. All of this takes time and preparation. And as we all know here on earth time is money.

The simple fact is that a seminary education (the place where men are prepared for the priesthood) is expensive. The Diocese of Joliet would like to set up a fund to help cover the cost of the education and preparation for the men studying to be future priests of our parishes in the Diocese of Joliet. The money collected during the second collection next weekend (November 12-13) throughout the diocese will go to set up this fund. This is a worthwhile goal as it will help to ensure that men and women throughout the diocese will have priests to bring them the sacraments of God for decades to come.





Priests are essential to our Catholic faith, as only these holy men can transform bread and wine into the life-giving Body and Blood of Christ. Although the number of priests has been on the decline for decades, the Diocese of Joliet has been blessed with an abundance of vocations to the priesthood.

Currently, our diocese has 23 men in seminary formation, which costs \$50,000 a year per seminarian. To ensure we are always able to support our seminarians both prayerfully and financially, the Diocese of Joliet has launched the *I Will Give You Shepherds* campaign.

At Masses next weekend, our parish will take up a second collection for this campaign. Gifts will be invested in an endowment designated specifically for seminarian education.

We will also welcome a seminarian to share his vocation story and tell us more about the campaign.


St. Anne Parish Financial Update

During the past few years, the Corona-19 pandemic has challenged society across the world. Despite the difficulties that many have faced during we are also thankful for the progress that has been made in developing vaccines and reducing the isolation we have experienced.

We are thankful for the continued generosity of parishioners for their continued financial support of the parish during these difficult times. The Finance Committee has continued to monitor parish income and expenses. Sunday offerings (whether by envelop or electronic donation) are the primary source of parish revenue.

The number of registered families in the parish was 2,190 in June 2021 and it increased 1% to 2230 in FY 2022. The total parishioners were 6,486 in June 2021 and it increased to 6,534 in June 2022. The number participants in the religious education in June 2021 was 666 compared to 636 in June 2022.

The graph below shows a reduction in Sunday offerings over the past few fiscal years. Sunday offerings represent 73% of total parish income, Religious Education represents 6% of total parish income and the remaining 21% from other donations and interest. With more parishioners returning to mass and other activities the decreasing trend in Sunday offerings leveled in FY 2022 although it remains below prepandemic offerings.



 The Fiscal Year (FY) begins in July and ends in June. FY 2022 began July 2021 and ended June 2022. Approximately 41% of parishioners make identifiable Sunday Offerings either through the envelope system or through electronic deposit. The following pie-chart shows the number of parishioners giving various amounts of contributions.




<u>Please continue to support our parish with your continued financial support.</u> Over the past couple of years, the electronic giving has enabled many parishioners to participate in giving in a more convenient manner. In addition, tax changes a few years ago enabled some elderly persons to make charitable donations directly from their Required Minimum Distributions (RMDS) from retirement accounts.

The St. Anne Parish Statement of Financial Position (dated 7/12/2022) indicates that the parish has Total Liabilities & Net Assets of \$5,555, 274 on June 30,2022 compared to \$5,359,413 on June 30, 2021. The parish prudently attempts to set aside some funds each year for eventual capital expenses for the update of aging buildings, equipment, and grounds.

Thank you for your commitment to St. Anne Parish and please continue to share your time, talent, and treasure with your parish.




