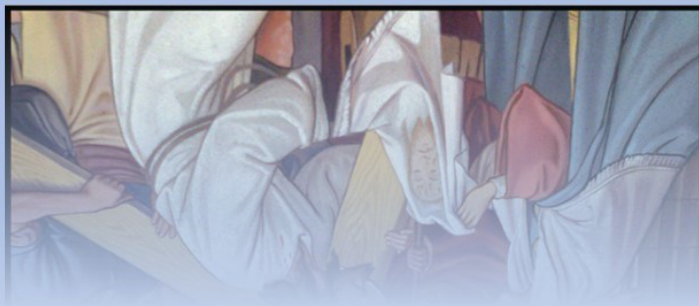

A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

This week the Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. Christians everywhere will wear ashes upon their foreheads. The ashes are meant to symbolize our sorrow over our sins and how they separate us from God. The ashes usually disappear from our foreheads by the next day. Our sorrow over our sins should remain with us if we are at all serious about the harm done to our relationship with God by our sins. To remind us of our sorrow and to encourage us to avoid sin and to repair our relationship with God, Christians traditionally undertake various forms of penance and prayer during this Season of Lent. While we often think of penance and prayer as punishment for our sins; it is better to think of penance and prayer as a form of discipline that shapes our minds and hearts to turn away from sin in the future. There are many different ways of penance and prayer during Lent that we can use.

One of these ways is the use of fasting from food during Lent. During Lent able bodied adult Catholics are bound by Church teaching to abstain from food on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (*please note that small amounts of food are allowed for those fasting on these days if needed to preserve strength or health. Also note that children and those persons who are sick or elderly are not bound by Church teaching to abstain from food on these days. Though I would encourage them to participate in fasting as much as they are able while not endangering their health.*) In addition, Catholics should abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent. These are the minimal requirements regarding fasting during Lent. Catholics are free to practice additional forms of fasting - such as abstaining from meat throughout the Season of Lent – as they wish.

Many Catholics choose to give up for Lent some pleasurable food or activity. This is another worthy form of penance. For example, a Catholic may choose to limit the amount of time spent online or watching television during Lent. Another example may be to stop participating in social media or to stop playing video games during Lent. You can choose your own form of penance that means the most to you.

Penance without prayer is unguided. We all should seek to draw closer to God through prayer during the Season of Lent. St. Anne Parish gives us all a wonderful opportunity to pray through the traditional practice of the Stations of the Cross which will be held in the church on Fridays during Lent at 7pm. In addition to this public form of prayer you may wish to add some additional private prayer to your life during Lent. For example, you may wish to pray all or part of the rosary on a daily or weekly basis during Lent, or you may desire to attend Eucharistic Adoration during the Season of Lent.

Finally, I strongly encourage you to go to confession during this Lenten Season.

Dear Friends,

When we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday, we will also take up a collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe.

Communism in this region fell more than 30 years ago, but the Church still struggles to rebuild after decades of oppressive rule. This is especially true in the former Soviet republic of Moldova, which, despite its political independence, is one of the poorest countries in Europe.

The Diocese of Chişinău covers all of Moldova and the unrecognized breakaway state of "Transnistria," currently occupied by Russian forces. Today the diocese contains 20 parishes and seven charity foundations that work to meet the spiritual and material needs of the people. This spirit of love for the most poor and needy is evident in Moldova's generous response not only to the needs of its own people but also to refugees fleeing the war in Ukraine. Working in cooperation with Caritas Moldova, the diocese has expanded its outreach and ability to reveal Christ's mercy to Moldova's vulnerable children and youth by establishing a network of care and support centers, where children and youth benefit from informal education programs in a safe, caring environment. The centers also help strengthen the parenting skills of mothers and fathers.

Your support and promotion of the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe is crucial to the success of ministries such as those offered by the Diocese of Chişinău.

Thank you for your help to restore the Church and build the future in Central and Eastern Europe.

LENT AND PASCHAL TRIDUUM GUIDELINES Fast and Abstinence Regulations

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on **Ash Wednesday** and all the **Fridays of Lent**.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**.
3. On **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

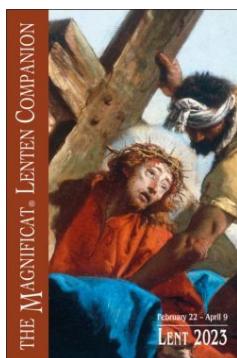

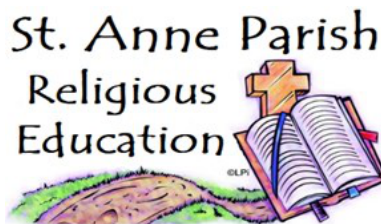

Love your Enemy

In the Gospel for this 7th Sunday on Ordinary Time, Jesus is asking us to do two important but challenging things. These are things that go against everything the world tells us we should do. First, we should always forgive rather than hold a grudge or take revenge. Second, we should love ALL people, whether we like them or not. No matter how badly people hurt us, we are asked to show God's mercy and treat everyone with love and respect. That is what being a Christian (a follower of Jesus) is all about - total, radical love! Is there someone right now that you can ask God to help you forgive? Do you have an "enemy" that you can ask God to help you to love?

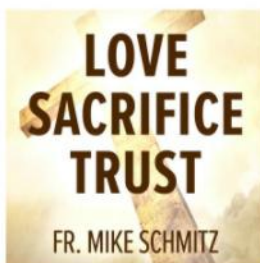

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are generally held the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month (some months this may vary) at 12:30 PM. Expectant parents are to call the Parish Office, six months before the birth of their child for preparation information. **Please do not choose Godparents until you receive the established Church guidelines for Godparents.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking the Sacrament of Marriage should call the parish office at least six months before the date of marriage. A wedding date may not be secured until meeting with the parish Deacon or Priest. At that time, the couple will be secured a date and begin the process of preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK
