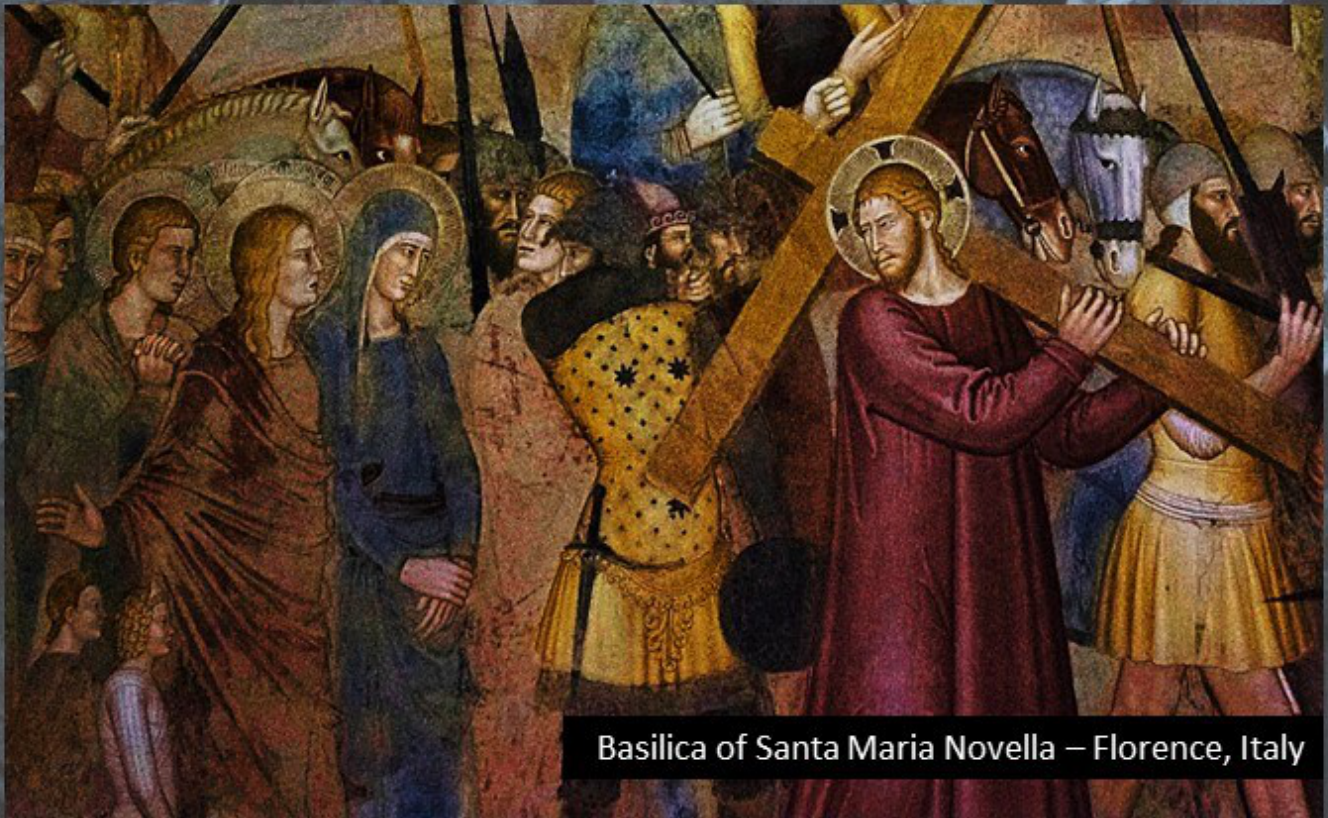

A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

Welcome to the most important week of the entire Christian year!

Look. The birth of our Lord Jesus Christ marks the beginning of the critical part of God's plan for our salvation and we would be greatly diminished in both knowledge of morality and of the true nature of God without the teaching of Jesus. Therefore, we rejoice over the birth of Jesus as celebrated at Christmas. Truly it is one of the most important events in the history of well, everything. God, the creator of the heavens and the earth, has entered into His own creation. However, it is not THE most important event in the history of everything. The most important event is recalled for us during this week when we as disciples of Jesus Christ remember the suffering and death Christ endured for our sake so that we might have the forgiveness of our sins and reunion with God. This week we rejoice at the resurrection of Jesus Christ which not only marks for us the truth of the claim that our sins are forgiven, but also is the proof that our hope in everlasting life is well-founded. As much as we should and do value the moral and ethical teachings of Jesus; we value even more the salvation Christ gained for us upon the cross and the promise of everlasting life for those who hold fast to Jesus.

Yes, this week is more important than Christmas.

I encourage all of you to participate in the liturgies of Holy Week as much as possible. Each day is charged with meaning for us as Christians. The entirety of Holy Week sums up our Christian faith in just a few days of remembrance and celebration. On Holy Thursday the Church will rejoice in the Mass of the Last Supper in which Jesus Christ instituted the Mass through which we receive the Holy Eucharist. On Good Friday the Church will sorrowfully recall the suffering and death of our Savior Jesus Christ during the Passion Service. And on the Easter Vigil (Holy Saturday) and on Easter morning (Easter Sunday) the Church will celebrate the resurrection. You will find the schedule for Holy Week in the bulletin and online.

PASCHAL TRIDUUM GUIDELINES Fast and Abstinence Regulations

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on **Ash Wednesday** and all the **Fridays of Lent**.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**.
3. On **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

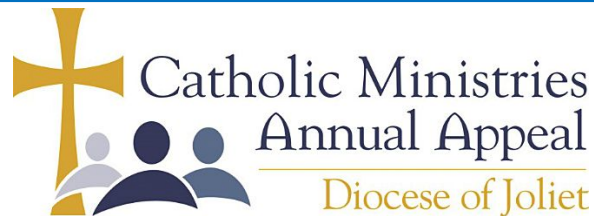

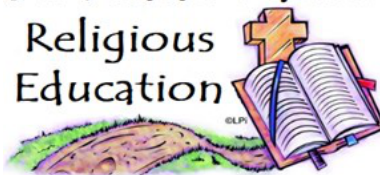

K-5 Family Scripture Connection

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday and hear the story of the Passion of Jesus. These are all of the things that happened to Jesus during His last week, before dying on the cross and rising again. This is **the most important story** of our Catholic faith! Before turning your attention to the Easter Bunny and candy, I encourage you to truly journey with Jesus this week and dive deep into the Passion as a family. Consider learning more by reading the Gospel stories, researching online, and/or watching YouTube videos about the Passion (Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday). Talk about what happened to Jesus and why it is so important. Pray the Stations of the Cross at Church or in your home. Plan to attend one or more of the Holy Week liturgies.

His Passion and our interests

Today we hear the whole Passion of Jesus, entering into Jerusalem as a hero and ending His week there as a condemned criminal. His Passion for us had purpose – to save us and allow us to have a chance to join Him in heaven. Does your focus (interests) in life match His purpose and hope for you to best receive His love? This Holy Week, though we aren't on campus for class, spend time living the depth of the great days of Triduum.



DASH 1: This week, reflect on your kerygma tree picture. Remember the purpose and stories that we have covered. Look at Jesus on the cross and all the events that led Him there. Consider reading over the Gospel of John 18 – 20 (which matches what we did in the last class before break.)

DASH 2: Coming to church on Holy Thursday or Good Friday are Faithbooster options for you. But here is another idea. I saw an advertisement for this family event at home to experience the story of Jesus in a unique way made for teens and turned into an online experience: <https://tickets.thethorn.com/> Check it out.

DASH 3: Come to any, or all days of Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil), be extra present to your prayer time and read any Gospel account of The Passion. Watch "The Thorn" (above) with your family or friends.

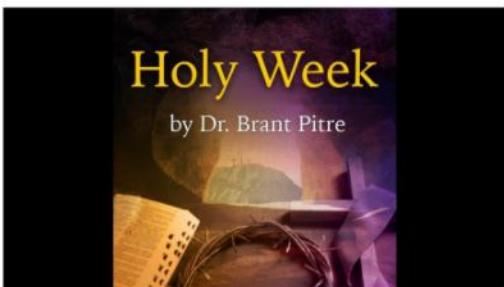
Triduum: A Spiritual Pilgrimage

A wedding date may not be secured until meeting with the parish Deacon or Priest. At that time, the couple will be secured a date and begin the process of preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage.
