

#### A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

Studying the Second Reading today from St. Paul's 2<sup>nd</sup> Letter to Timothy reminds me of watching the gameshow The Price is Right as a child. No doubt you are asking yourself the question "how is that?" Imagine the scene. There is Bob Barker announcing the next game to the contestants and as everyone's anticipation is raised to a fever pitch he calls out to his assistants to reveal the wonderful prizes that could be won. Both the crowd and the contestants see the potential prizes and begin to cheer. St. Paul in today's Second Reading is taking the place of Bob Barker and we, the listeners to his letter, are the excited crowd and contestants.

There is a difference however between the game show and real life. The prizes to be won on the game show are simple material goods: a new washer and dryer combo, a jet ski, or perhaps a new car. You may or may not need them. You may or may not even want them. And whether you want them or not or need them or not; they belong to this world and will therefore eventually break or be rendered obsolete. The prize that St. Paul tells us that Jesus Christ has revealed to the world through the Gospel is eternal life with God. A prize that we all should want, and a prize that never breaks or becomes old-fashioned.

This makes St. Paul an even greater presenter than Bob Barker (and St. Paul didn't even have television or radio to work within his day). Essentially what St. Paul was doing as he traveled from place to place proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ was revealing to his listeners the fabulous prize that could be theirs if only they would accept the Word of God and become disciples of Jesus Christ.

#### A quick reminder:

On Saturday, March 25 between 2pm and 5pm we will hold a special Eucharistic Adoration in the church. During this Eucharistic Adoration there will be periods of silence, readings from the writings of the saints, and live music. You are welcome to come for the entire three hours or for just a part.



#### K-5 Family Scripture Connection

Transfiguration means to be transformed or changed. In today's Gospel story, we hear that Jesus was transfigured so that "His face shone like the sun and His clothes became white as light." This helped Peter, James, and John to understand that Jesus truly was God! Sometimes we need to be transfigured, or changed, too. Is fear, anger, pride, or jealousy keeping you from loving God and others as you should? Is there someone you need to forgive? Do you need to learn to trust or to be better friends with God? Perhaps, during this 2<sup>nd</sup> week of Lent, you can take some time to ask God to help you transfigure closer to Him and into the best Christian you can be!



#### K-5 Schedule

Classes are in session as usual for the next three weeks. This week, March 6–8, all students in grades 2 – DASH 1 will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation during their regular class time.



#### Willing to be Changed?

Students in DASH 2 are watching season 1 of The Chosen and answering reflection questions. For episode 2, this was one of the questions: Can you imagine feeling as loved/changed by a relationship with Jesus? Why might some people be scared of this? The responses are interesting, most say "NO" it would be too scary while there are a few beautiful souls who want that change that Mary Magdalene portrayed. It is good to keep in mind, in our fear that we aren't enough, or struggle to be "holy enough" that: "... Jesus came and touched them, saying,

"Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw noone else but Jesus alone." The disciples saw amazing things and were afraid and Jesus understood their fears, like He understands us and our needs today. Talk with Him this Lent.

**DASH 1:** Students will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation during class time and then go back to class for a big conversation, atonement – why did Jesus have to die for our sins.

**DASH 2:** Your theme today, when you are invited to the parish Reconciliation Service, is "Keeping it Holy." Look for that teaching video in your Google docs, and listen for how to live holiness better in your lives.



**DASH 3:** Today, March 5, you will come from 4:00–6:00 PM which will include time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation *and* a small group session about the Holy Spirit.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking the Sacrament of Marriage should call the parish office at least six months before the date of marriage. A wedding date may not be secured until meeting with the parish Deacon or Priest. At that time, the couple will be secured a date and begin the process of preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage.


