NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

The Second Invitation: Monthly Encounter Nights

Monthly “Encounter Nights” that help parishioners encounter Jesus in the Eucharist personally during the Year of Parish Revival, the National Eucharistic Revival proposes that every parish begins a monthly hour of Eucharistic adoration for “encounter,” so that every parishioner has the opportunity to meet Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. As the year begins, an “Encounter Night” guide will be provided along with other resources to give a detailed template that could be used, a list of liturgical items needed, appropriate prayers, and suggested options for songs. These holy hours of Eucharistic adoration are planned for the evening or during the weekend—preferably a time that most members of the parish could attend—in a desire for every Catholic to encounter the Lord anew. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is encouraged to be offered, and appropriate readings or talks could be given.

At St. Anne, we have Adoration and Confession on Wednesday evenings from 7:00-8:00 PM, Adoration on Friday mornings following 8:00 AM Mass, Confession on Saturday from 3:30-4:30 PM.

Near the shores of Galilee, Jesus’ words to his first disciples were “Come and See.” In that moment of Encounter, something changed in the hearts of those men forever. Something in their lives and hearts finally made sense in meeting Jesus—a promise was fulfilled. Do you remember the first time you met Jesus in the Eucharist? What happened to your heart, the direction of your life, the desires you had? Encounters with Jesus change us. During this Year of Parish Revival, we want all the faithful to be invited to “Come and See” in hopes that they truly Encounter the presence of Jesus alive in the Eucharist.

A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

It's not for nothing that the Second Vatican Council declared that the Holy Eucharist is the "source and summit" of the Christian life. The Eucharist is the highest, greatest Sacrament of the Church as well as the most important act of worship in the life of the Church. The Eucharist is the wellspring of God's grace in our lives that enable us to live in the world as disciples of Jesus Christ. As a child my family visited a deep, large fresh water spring in Florida from which wells up out of the ground thousands of gallons of water every second. So much water flows up that immediately a sizable river forms in which visitors can swim or boat in it. God's grace in the Sacrament of the Eucharist is like that. A vast upwelling of grace that sustains us and carries us along in our lives. Sadly, many Catholics miss out on receiving the Eucharist or that don't fully appreciate the Eucharist.

The Catholic Church in the United States launched back in 2022 the "National Eucharistic Revival." The purpose of the Revival is to deepen our Catholic understanding of God's gift of the Holy Eucharist. To this end there will be what is called a "National Eucharistic Congress" in July of 2024 to be held in Indianapolis which will be the culminating event of the Revival. Now, you may not plan on attending the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis; but you will find that St. Anne Parish is planning several events to help deepen our Catholic faith in the Holy Eucharist as part of the National Eucharistic Revival.

Starting this Fall the St. Anne Adult Faith Formation Ministry will be presenting a special program entitled Presence: the Mystery of the Eucharist. This will be a three-part series held with the first part in October with following parts in November and December. There will be a morning and an evening session for each part. I hope that you will join us for each of these parts. You can find more information about them in the parish bulletin or on the parish website.

St. Anne Parish will also be hosting a walk-through exhibit highlighting some of the many miracles that have been associated with the Blessed Sacrament this November. This exhibit will be open to all parishioners and will take place during the weekend of November 17-19. Please continue to check the bulletin or the website for further details as they are released.

I also encourage you to come to Eucharistic Adoration during the week. This is a wonderful opportunity to simply sit in the presence of God and pray. Adoration is a wonderful time to simply be at peace and quiet for as much or as little time as you want. Adoration is held at St. Anne Parish every Wednesday night between 7pm and 8pm and every Friday morning between 8.30am and 9am.

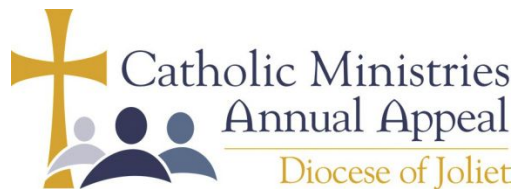

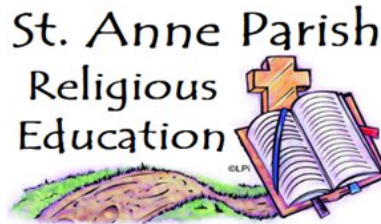

KENDALL COUNTY COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

The Kendall County Community Food Pantry continues to serve families from the County in need of food assistance.

Interesting Statistics:

- ◆ 2,201 neighbors served with 939 being new in 2022
- ◆ 6,540 includes all family members of the neighbors fed in 2022
- ◆ 280 families (on average) were served per week in 2022 with a recent week serving 315
- ◆ 14,560 shopping carts were loaded up
- ◆ 72,800 meals provided per shopping cart. This assumes 5 meals can be made with each cart (which is a low number)
- ◆ \$175 assumption of what each cart is worth (again a low number), then...
- ◆ \$2,548,000 was saved by all households through food distribution at KCCFP

Cash donations go a long way. For every dollar donated, the pantry can purchase \$8.00 in food from the Northern Illinois Food Bank.
