The Third Invitation: Preaching Series and Small Group Initiative "Jesus and the Eucharist"

The preaching and homilies of our priests, "inserted in a unique way into the Eucharistic celebration, from which it receives special force and vigor, certainly has a particular role... to the extent that it expresses the profound faith of the sacred minister and is impregnated with love" (Evangelii Nuntiandi, no. 43). During this Year of Parish Revival, we are encouraging parish priests to implement a series of Sunday homilies to be devoted exclusively to the Eucharist. Eucharistic worship and the implications of this worship are vital for our whole lives. These homilies might cover:

- † Paschal Mystery and the Eucharist
- † Real Presence and Eucharistic Worship
- † Eucharist and the Call to Holiness
- † Eucharist and the Call to Evangelize and Serve

Along with this preaching series, each parish will be invited to participate in a small group program called "Jesus and the Eucharist." This program has been developed specifically for the Year of Parish Revival by a team of Catholic experts who are working closely with the National Eucharistic Revival. Every parish in the country is encouraged to use this program, in union with the preaching series, at least once. By attending this series of homilies preached at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, small groups not only receive the gift of important catechetical formation but an encounter with Jesus Himself. The small groups will provide formation and opportunities for growth in faith and love for the Eucharist in union with the preaching of their own pastor who leads them to this Eucharistic Encounter at its very source, the Holy Mass. These two elements complement each other and are meant to be paired in an intentional way.

Besides, even if I could remember, the people of St. Anne Parish haven't given me much reason to gossip anyway.

The Convocation this year takes place between Monday afternoon on September 18 and Thursday morning on September 21. Since all the priests of the diocese are either required or invited to attend; the daily Masses on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of this week will be replaced by Communion Services led by our deacons. In addition, there will not be confessions held on Wednesday, September 20. However, there will be Eucharistic Adoration on Wednesday evening at 7:00 PM as is normally scheduled. The weekend Masses will be as normal.

I want to thank all of the parish Religious Education staff and volunteers who have been working hard to get ready for the beginning of RE classes this week. It will be good to see the parish halls and classrooms filled with students once again.

Finally, I want to mention that the traditional blessing of animals will take place on Saturday, October 7 at 9:00 AM. We will meet outside the church by the bell tower. So bring your creeping, crawling, leaping, or flying beasts for the blessing.


THE 2023 CATHOLIC MINISTRIES ANNUAL APPEAL IS NOW UNDERWAY


ST. ANNE MUSIC MINISTRY FALL MUSIC



KENDALL COUNTY COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

The Kendall County Community Food Pantry continues to serve families from the County in need of food assistance.

Interesting Statistics:

♦ 2,201 neighbors served with 939 being new in 2022

♦ 6,540 includes all family members of the neighbors fed in 2022

♦ 280 families (on average) were served per week in 2022 with a recent week serving 315

♦ 14,560 shopping carts were loaded up

72,800 meals provided per shopping cart. This assumes 5 meals can be made with each cart

(which is a low number)

\$175 assumption of what each cart is worth (again a low number), then...

\$2,548,000 was saved by all households through food distribution at KCCFP

Cash donations go a long way. For every dollar donated, the pantry can purchase \$8.00 in food from the Northern Illinois Food Bank.
