A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

In today's Second Reading St. Paul remarks to his listeners that they have become an example of Christian faith and devotion to many other followers of Christ throughout the region. For they have not only heard the Word of God, but they have truly incorporated the Word of God into how they live their lives. This is a wonderful example for us to follow. Here at St. Anne there are a number of upcoming opportunities to worship God; deepen our devotion to God; and to serve God and our neighbor. Some of these opportunities are listed below, but there are others. I encourage you to read through the bulletin for all the details.

This week features two important feast days of the Church in which we recall our brothers and sisters in Christ who have died. The Solemnity of All Saints – which is a holy day of obligation – is on Wednesday, November 1. Masses will be held at 7am, 12pm, 5.30pm, and 7pm. The Feast of All Souls is on Thursday, November 2. Masses will be held at 7am and 7pm. The difference between these two feast days is that on All Saints we praise God for our deceased brothers and sisters in Christ who are now rejoicing with God in His Kingdom; and on All Souls we pray for our deceased brothers and sisters who are still striving to purify their souls so as to join the saints in the Kingdom of God.

Training for new altar servers will take place on Saturday, November 4 at 10am in the church. Boys and girls in grades 5 and up are invited to come and learn how to serve during the Mass.

The next presentation of Presence: the Mystery of the Eucharist will be held on Tuesday, November 7. There will be two sessions: the first at 9.30am and the second at 7pm. You need not have attended the first presentation to come to this presentation.

Coming up later in November St. Anne Parish will be holding a collection to support the Kendall County Community Food Pantry. On the weekend of November 11-12 food items can be dropped off in the church narthex when you come to Mass. The food pantry is looking for the following items:

Annual Parish Financial Update


Fiscal Year 2023 (July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023)

Sunday Collections:

In the past fiscal year, our total Sunday collections amounted to \$1,041,184. This figure is 13% lower than our budgeted collection target of \$1,200,000. This shortfall has contributed to the overall revenue deficit observed this year. When we compare our current year's Sunday collections to the previous three-year average of \$1,089,263,

we notice a drop of approximately 5%. This slight decline may seem marginal in isolation, but it can have significant impacts on our overall budget and requires our attention.

It is important to remember that the previous three-year average includes two years affected significantly by the COVID-19 pandemic. This challenging period saw a decrease in our Sunday collections due to the restrictions on inperson services, leading to lower-than-expected contributions.



Overall Revenue -vs- Expenses:

During the fiscal year, our total revenue was \$1,483,477, falling slightly short of our projected budget of \$1,519,450 by \$35,973. This represents a variance of approximately 1% below our expected revenue.

Regarding expenditures, our total outlay for the year amounted to \$1,510,718, surpassing our budgeted estimate of \$1,408,538 by a noteworthy \$102,180. This overage represents about a 7% overrun from our original budget. Notably, it's important to highlight that these expenses incorporated a \$300,000 transfer from operating cash to our reserve funds. This decision, aimed at bolstering our long-term financial stability, significantly contributed to the over expenditure. Beyond this, the reasons for the additional outlays are diverse, ranging from unexpected maintenance costs to an escalation in utilities and various operational expenditures.

Cash Position:

Our operating cash refers to the liquid assets available for our day-to-day expenses, including salaries, utilities, maintenance, and other running costs. At the end of this fiscal year, our operating cash in the bank stands at \$408,763. This reflects a decrease of approximately 24% from our starting balance of \$537,269. This reduction is largely attributable to the expenses exceeding our revenues during this fiscal year, which we have discussed in earlier segments of this memo.

Our reserve cash, which represents our longer-term savings and investments, has shown an increase over the course of the fiscal year. Our reserve cash balance at the end of the fiscal year was \$5,558,264, reflecting an approximate 10% increase from our starting balance of \$5,036,319. This increase in reserve funds provides a strong safety net for our parish and demonstrates our commitment to ensuring financial stability.






Simply Complex



Bishop Hicks' Column

CONTEMPLATING THE CONVOCATION

BESIDES CELEBRATING MASS ON SUNDAYS, a question people frequently ask me is, "What do priests do during the week?" My initial response is that priesthood is so much more than a 9-to-5 job—it is more like a 24/7 vocation.

A priest is called to serve God and His people, and to assist his

bishop by governing, teaching, and sanctifying. In modern times, it may seem like a priest is expected to be able to administer with an MBA, counsel with the spirituality of the saints, offer a love for the poor of Saint Mother Teresa, maintain the constant energy of a newly ordained priest, and resolve issues with the wisdom of a seasoned pastor.

While it is virtually impossible to embody all those expectations, leading a parish with a wide variety of ministries and missions in the Catholic Church has become more complicated and challenging. Therefore, there is a growing need to attend to the professional development and spiritual growth of priests. In the Diocese of Joliet, we are blessed to have a director of on-going formation for priests, Father Sunny Castillo, who currently also serves as pastor of Mary Queen of Heaven Parish in Elmhurst.

Besides coordinating a variety of programs for spiritual, educational, and professional growth, Father Sunny and a dedicated team of priests, staff, and volunteers also organize a bi-annual convocation. This September, the priests of the diocese all gathered at our four-day convocation to pray, grow in camaraderie, and learn from a series of talks presented by Sister Miriam James Heidland from the Society of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity.

Sister Miriam's daily topics highlighted our theme, The Journey of the Priestly Heart: Building a Eucharistic Legacy in the Priesthood. At the very beginning, she said that one of the greatest dangers to priests is "a hardening of heart." Using a powerful example, she explained that after the child Jesus was found in the temple, the Gospel says that the Holy Family returned home, and Jesus *grew*. She warned us, "Woe is the day you stop *growing* as priests." This stirring advice is good not only for priests, but also to anyone, especially when it comes to the spiritual life.

I wish space allowed me to share all her many other valuable teachings. Towards the end of the convocation, after Sister Miriam had departed, I pointed out to everyone that she has a true and deep respect for priests. I was moved to say, "I hope you love your priesthood as much as she does."

Besides listening to Sister Miriam's presentations, we also celebrated daily Mass, prayed the Liturgy of the Hours, and had the opportunity to pray a rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet and daily holy hour with adoration and benediction. And between the prayers and talks, the priests shared with each other their struggles, their triumphs, and their leadership insights.

Evenings were spent enjoying rare social time with brother priests. At one dinner, we honored those marking a special jubilee year of their priesthood. The next evening, we celebrated our upcoming 75th anniversary as a diocese. Not only did we enjoy good food and conversation, but we competed in a friendly trivia game to see who knew the most about the history of the Diocese of Joliet. What a joy to learn more about the deep roots and richness of our diocese!

The last day of the convocation allowed me the opportunity to give a "state of the union" presentation in which I shared a good deal of information and issues, including a Q-and-A session and groupwide dialogue. Appropriately, before departing, we gathered for Mass one more time to thank God for all the blessings and fruits of the convocation.

I left the convocation with a smile on my face, deeply grateful to God for the time and space to renew our minds, bodies, and souls as a presbyterate. My gratitude bubbled over for our priests, and all the clergy, religious, and laity who make this Church so vibrant and wonderful.

May we all continue to *grow* in the knowledge, love, and service of the Lord and each other.
