In the entire history of the Catholic Church, there have been numerous Eucharistic miracles approved by the Catholic Church as truly worthy of belief. The Vatican Eucharistic Miracles Photographic Exhibition faithfully recounts many well-documented miraculous occurrences for us. Knowledge of these miracles strengthens our faith in Christ and His Church.

They are visible proof of Jesus Christ's Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist.

The Exhibit was created by Blessed Carlo Acutis, a 15-year-old from Milan, Italy, who was beatified on October 10, 2020.

We highly encourage you to make the time in your schedule to view the exhibit during this Year of the Eucharistic Revival.



Carlo's exhibition presents a selection of the main Eucharistic Miracles which occurred over the centuries in various countries that are recognized by the Church. There are about 158 miracles collected, each on a 2' x 3' laminated panel. Through these panels you can "virtually visit" the places where the miracles happened.

Please join us as we present the photographic display of the Eucharistic Miracles of the World. Panels are displayed in an art gallery setting that allows for a virtual tour of over 150 miracles from 22 countries.

A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

Last week I wrote about some of the practical aspects of the return of the Precious Blood of Christ to Holy Communion at the weekend Masses. This week I want to mention some of the more spiritual aspects of the Precious Blood of Christ. Please note that this is only one of the many aspects of the Holy Eucharist. To describe all the effects of the Holy Eucharist would take a much, much longer bulletin article.

We often refer to Jesus Christ as the "Lamb of God;" but do we spend much time thinking about what this phrase means? The Holy Mass deliberately references the sacrifice of Our Lord and Savior upon the cross which occurred during the Feast of Passover. This feast which was (and remains) one of the most important Jewish feasts recalls the last and most terrible of God's display of power in Egypt prior to the Exodus of the Israelite people. During this moment of God's might every firstborn male – both man and beast – was slain except those of the Israelites. The Israelites, who had been forewarned by God through Moses, had prepared for this moment and for their coming flight into the desert by preparing unleavened bread and slaying and cooking a lamb for food for their upcoming journey. The blood of the lamb was marked on the doorposts of their dwellings as a sign that God's own people dwelt inside, and that the destroying angel of God was to "Passover" this house instead killing every firstborn male inside. Thus, the Israelite people would be saved.

During the Mass, at the moment of the consecration of the wine into the Precious Blood; the Blood of Jesus Christ, who is the Lamb of God, becomes truly real and present to us. This is in effect the same blood of the lamb that was marked on the doorposts of the Israelite people as a sign that the destroying angel was to spare the people inside from God's wrath and justice. When we at Holy Communion receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ as part of the action which occurs is that we are being marked as belonging to God so that we might be spared from the dreadful wrath of God that is the natural result of our sins. Please note that this is not the only effect the Holy Eucharist has on us. We are also being inwardly transformed by the power of the Eucharist to become more like Jesus Christ so that we might not need God's mercy as much to escape the effects of our sins, since with God's grace and our cooperation with that grace we will not sin as much or as gravely. When we say "amen" to the words "the Body of Christ or the Blood of Christ" we are saying in effect that we believe that this is truly the Lamb of God who has the power to save us from our sins.

Having written about the Holy Eucharist I want to encourage you to attend the exhibit that our parish will be hosting this Friday through Sunday (November 17-19) that describes some of the miracles that are connected to the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. You can find more details in the bulletin. The exhibit will be open before and after the weekend Masses so please plan on coming early or staying late and attending the exhibit.




Pledge your gift to the CMAA



You have knit me together the way I am, and given me life and laughter, friends and the faces of kind strangers, and a world of wonder and new discovery. Grant me the freedom and the courage to discover you anew each day in the people I meet, in the places I go, in the sounds I hear and the things I see. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

DAY 5 NOVEMBER 29

Lord Jesus, it is so easy to be tempted as you were tempted in the desert; to make poor decisions for quick gains and satisfaction; to turn the wonderful gifts of your generosity towards unworthy and selfish ends. Give me, day by day, the same Spirit of strength with which you faced down those desert temptations of power, wealth and honour; that my desires and motives, my words and actions, may always be for the greater glory of God, my Lord. Amen.

DAY 6 NOVEMBER 30

Father, as I look back on this day, there are so many teeming thoughts, such a babble of words, and such a blur of activity, that it is difficult to see your gentle and faithful presence amid it all. Show yourself to me today, and every day. Amen.

DAY 7 DECEMBER 1

God our Father, praise to you! I am surrounded by so many good people, if only I take the time to notice: people who speak your word of compassion and kindness; people who act to give reality to your justice and reconciliation; people whose lives are good seed growing in rich soil. Father, you are entire goodness and you are goodness for me. Creator of all things, who hold all things in being for me, give me faith in you and in myself, your creation. Amen.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are generally held the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month (some months this may vary) at 12:30 PM. Expectant parents are to call the Parish Office, six months before the birth of their child for preparation information. Please do not choose Godparents until you receive the established Church guidelines for Godparents.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking the Sacrament of Marriage should call the parish office at least six months before the date of marriage. A wedding date may not be secured until meeting with the parish Deacon or Priest. At that time, the couple will be secured a date and begin the process of preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

If there is anyone at home who cannot get to Mass and the Sacraments because of illness or age, please call the parish office at anytime to request the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.




