

A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

If you are reading this bulletin article before or after Mass this weekend, I encourage you to go to the parish hall and check out the large exhibit on the miracles associated with the Holy Eucharist. This exhibit helps us as Catholics to keep in the forefront of our minds one of the critical truths of the Catholic faith: the Holy Eucharist is truly God present among His people.

Last week I wrote about how the Holy Eucharist marks us as belonging to God's people. This week I wish to write on how the Holy Eucharist transforms us to be more like Jesus Christ, the Son of God. When we as Catholics say that God has saved us from our sins, we do not imagine that God has merely issued some form of edict that says in effect "not guilty," but then leaves us as the same sinful people that we were before the sacrifice of Jesus Christ upon the cross. God's saving plan for the human race is grander than just making a declaration of innocence. Indeed, God's saving plan is for His people to become holy and innocent. As we cannot become holy and innocent on our own; God provides to us the means to accomplish His saving plan of restoration of holiness and innocence. The Holy Eucharistic is the greatest means that God has provided to us to carry out this great design.

The Holy Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, has a transformative effect upon us. This transformation is from being a sinful man or woman separated from God to a holy man or woman united to God. To achieve this great change (and what a change it is) it is necessary that the Eucharist itself be great. There is nothing and no one greater than Jesus Christ who is the Second Person of the Holy Trinity. When we as Catholics say that the Holy Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Christ, that is exactly what we mean. Although its appearance may seem to be ordinary bread and wine its reality is that of God Himself. There is no greater means of transformation in all of existence. God truly desires us, His people, to become more like His Son Jesus Christ; and He has provided the means to do so.

Now, it is true that the Holy Eucharist does not normally have a "magical" effect on us. People do not often receive Holy Communion and walk away radically transformed in that moment completely freed from vice and sin. While it would certainly be convenient for us if God did work this way, the truth is God does not want to control us or take us over. God does not desire slaves who have no choice but to do as He says. Rather, God desires sons and daughters who willingly choose to follow him. We are meant to cooperate with God's gift of the Holy Eucharist. This means that we must be free to cooperate fully or partially or not at all with the transformative effect of the Holy Eucharistic. We human beings struggle to cooperate fully with God's saving power so our progress in transformation is often slow, uneven, and sometimes it runs in reverse. Yet, God continues to provide the means of becoming more like Christ to us so that however long it may take we may continue to participate in God's great plan of salvation for us.



Bishop Hicks' Column

LAUNCHING OUR 75TH JUBILEE





A "JUBILEE" IS A SPECIAL ANNIVERSARY, marking a certain time period. For example, a twenty-fifth anniversary is universally recognized as a silver jubilee, whereas the fiftieth is known as the golden jubilee. This month, we are officially launching the 75th Anniversary of the Diocese of

Joliet, or the celebration of our diamond jubilee.

As they say, "diamonds are forever." This celebration gives us the opportunity to honor our past, commemorate our present, and look forward to the future with hope. Our year-long celebration will officially begin in December 2023 and end in December 2024. However, we have a few things happening in November that I would like to share with you and encourage your participation.

On Monday, November 6, 2023, we launched the first episode of a 14-part podcast series produced specifically for our 75th anniversary. In our pilot episode, Fr. Tom Paul, the chair of the Jubilee planning committee, and I talked about different ways that you can participate in our anniversary celebration. If you are a podcast afficionado, just listen on your favorite app by searching "Faith Into Action." Or you may try watching it on the diocesan YouTube channel. Either way, the links can always be found in the 75th Anniversary section of our website, **diojoliet.org/75th**, which can be read in English, Spanish, and Polish.

As we celebrate with great faith, hope, and love, I want to make sure we have many opportunities to pray together. A nine-day novena will begin on November 25, the Saturday after Thanksgiving. This Novena of Grace is based on the writings of the patron saint of our diocese, St. Francis Xavier. For daily prayers and devotions, visit the website or see your Sunday bulletin.

The novena concludes on December 3, 2023. On that same day we will host an event at the Blanchette Catholic Center at 1 p.m., where I will bless a new statue of St. Francis Xavier. He will beautifully welcome employees and visitors at the main entrance to our diocesan offices to remind us of our missionary call to share our faith with all people.

Then, for an entire year we will celebrate in ways that highlight my vision of catechesis, evangelization, and faith into action:

- We will promote **catechesis** through faith formation to help the next generations *know about* Jesus and the Church. Through novenas, prayer cards, and lesson plans, we will grow the knowledge of our faith for all ages. We are blessed that our celebration is occurring in harmony with the threeyear National Eucharistic Revival, which reminds us how the Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives.
- 2. We will also continue to **evangelize**, which is needed to truly know Jesus and *love* Him. True evangelization is realized when we believe in our minds, hearts, and souls that Jesus is real: He loves us, and we love Him. Through liturgies, prayers, media posts, podcasts, printed calendars, and commemorative books, we will actively **share** our faith and love of Jesus, who gives us eternal life through His life, suffering, death, and resurrection.
- 3. With catechesis and evangelization as our foundation, we will continue to put our **faith into action**. As Catholics, we *serve* the poor, the needy, and the marginalized. We speak for the unborn, the stranger, the abandoned, and those who are in most need of our care. As part of the 75th anniversary, I encourage all parishes to establish a day of service in the fall of 2024, responding to the various needs of each distinct community.

Jesus gave us such an incredible gift in the Church, and as baptized Christians, we are called to pass our faith on to the next generations. No one wants to belong to a Church that is merely surviving. Instead, we should have a burning desire to be a thriving Church that truly reflects God's light and God's love.

I encourage you to participate in some aspect of our 75th Jubilee during this next year. There is truly something for everyone, and I want each of you to know that YOU are a vital part of our celebration. So, together, rooted in Christ, let's live out the theme of our 75th anniversary: founded in faith, called to witness, and sent forth to serve!



Purpose and Comparison



DASH 2 Today is your last session...for November. We meet up again, at a different time for reconciliation, on Sunday December 3.


