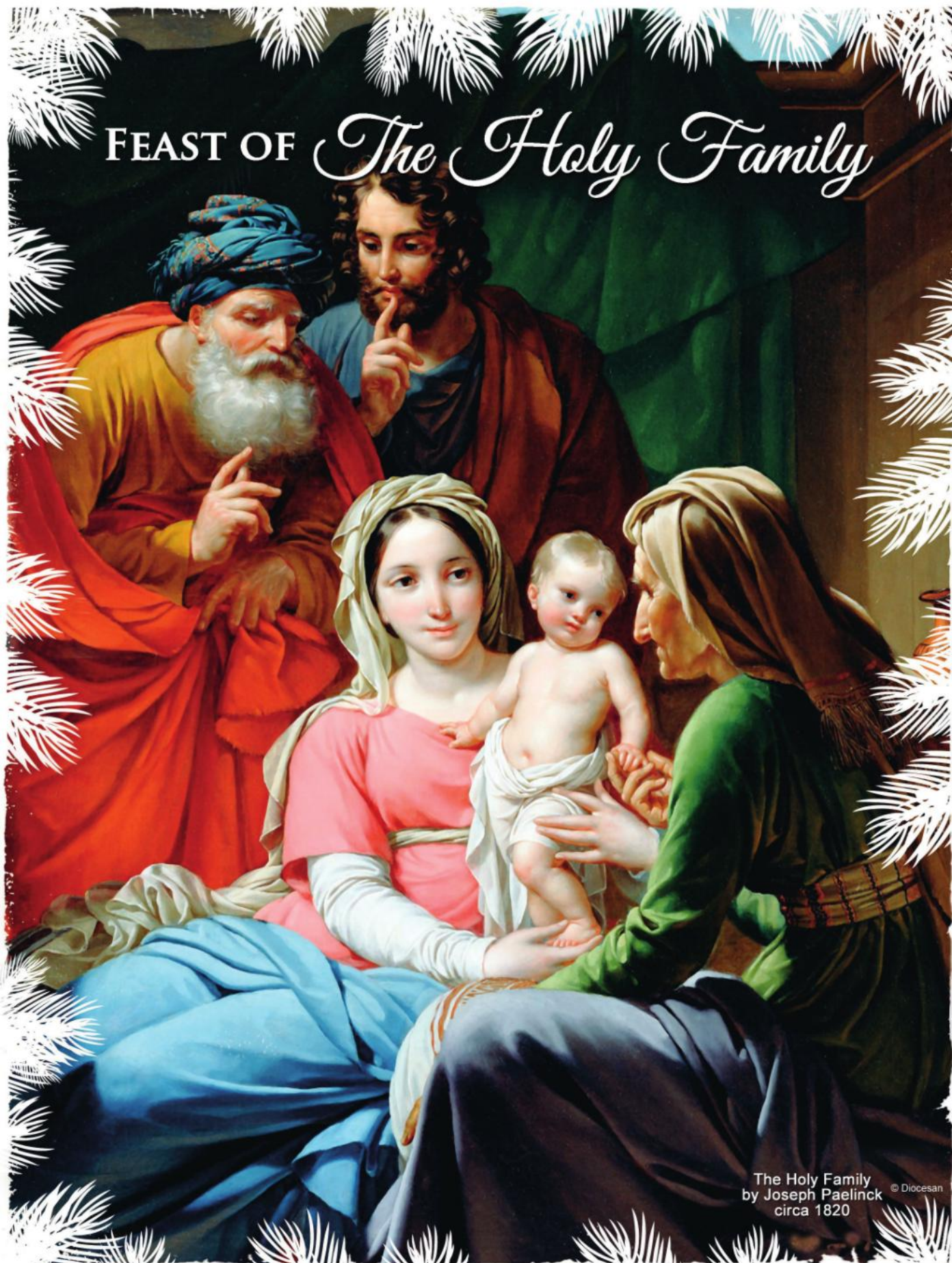

## A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

Today the Church celebrates what I think is one of its most important feast days: the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

One of the defining characteristics of our Christian faith is the fact that we do not only have a one-to-one relationship with God. By this I mean that although we always should have a personal relationship with God that is person to person; this is not the only form of our relationship to God. We also relate to God as a people, as a collective, as shown by the numerous examples in Holy Scripture in which God acts to save not just individual persons, but the entire community of people that God has made His own. The Holy Scriptures not only give us accounts of the saving power of God in action to save His people, but they also relate how the people of God come together to praise, thank, and worship God. If necessary, a single person may be the people of God in a particular place and time. However, this would be very unusual. In the normal course of events every believer in Christ in a particular place and time should come together and act as the people of God; strengthening and encouraging each other to deepen each other's own unique personal relationship with God, and reinforcing their individual faith through group prayer, worship, and holy works.

This is a wonderful high-level analysis of how a Christian people should act. Yet, how does it work in practice? After all, most of us struggle to associate with large groups of people on any sort of regular basis. Fortunately for us as Christians we do not have to try to learn how to worship with or pray with or act with large groups of a hundred or a thousand people. Instead, we start off by learning to be part of the people of God within our families. It is within the family that we learn to act toward each other with charity and kindness. It is within the family that we learn to pray to God. It is within the family that we learn to relate to God as a group, as a people. It is within the family that we learn how to come together to worship God. The family is the school of the Christian people. The place in which we learn to act and live as a Christian people.

Since the family is so important to our learning how to be a part of the Christian people; God has given to us the great example of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as a model for family life and a source of continuous encouragement to us here and now. We look to the Holy Family as described for us in the Gospels and see their obvious care and love for each other and seek to emulate those qualities in our own lives. Furthermore, knowing that the Holy Family is most certainly a continued part of the Christian people (for its members are not separated from us) we ask Joseph and Mary to intercede for us with their son Jesus Christ that our own families may be strengthened and that we might be encouraged to remain true to God forever.

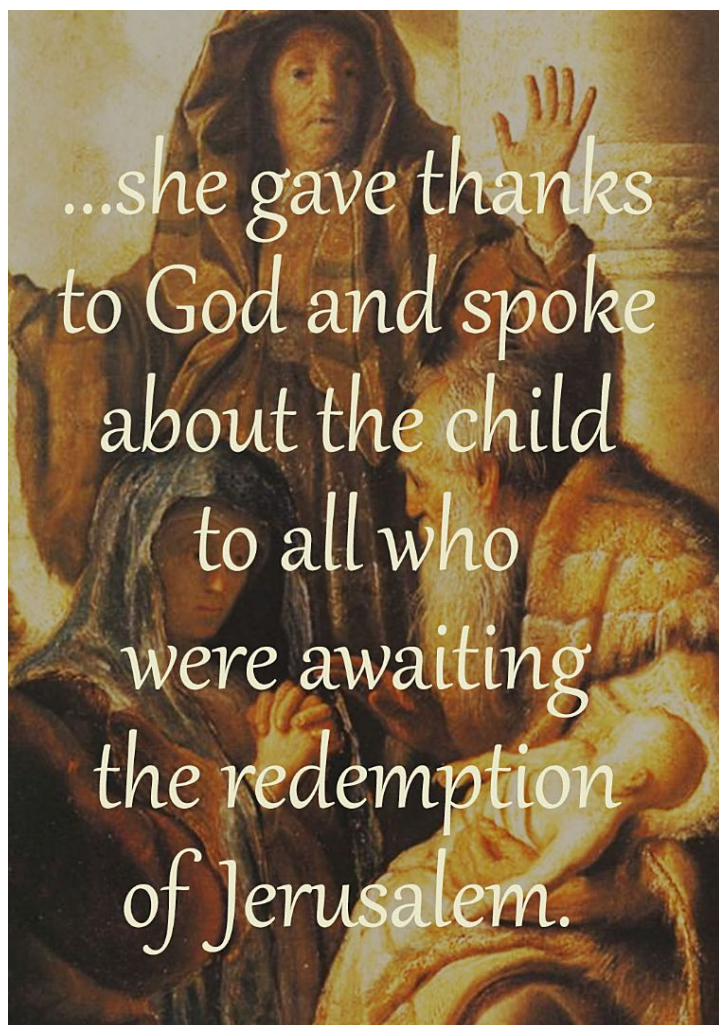

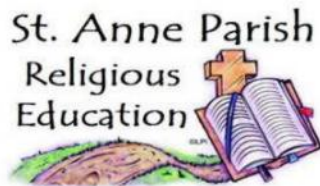

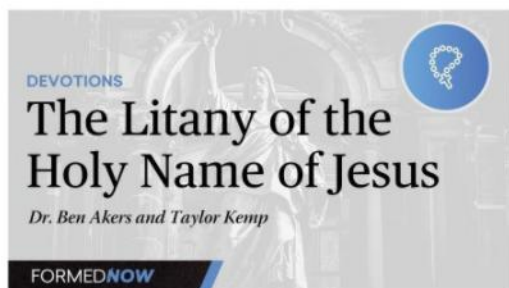

## St. Vincent de Paul Society Gospel Reflection

Today is the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. During our New Year may our families "grow in wisdom and have the favor of God upon them."

The St. Vincent de Paul Society offers the opportunity to serve Our Lord, lending a helping hand to families to give them the opportunity to grow in wisdom and accept God's favor. Since our conference began in 2018, we have received over 600 requests for help. During the last fiscal year, which ended September 30, we provided financial aid to 91 families and individuals who had asked for assistance. This aid included \$17,920 to prevent utility shut offs, \$11,421 to help with housing, and \$3,770 for car repairs. But just as important, we worked with many others, listening to their plight and offering advice and support.

Our purpose is not to just aid with finances but to offer Christian love and prayer for all who come to us. There are some, like the soul who made an incorrect business decision and needed time to recover, where financial aid isn't necessary, but there are many who are desperate and require some financial support. Through the vast generosity of your kind contributions we are able to do both, to give Christian love as well as some monetary support. Allow us to pass on to all of you the gratitude of all those who've contacted us. We are blessed to receive each thank you personally, but it is you who they are thanking. May the Lord bless you all.

## KENDALL COUNTY COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

The Kendall County Community Food Pantry continues to serve families from the County in need of food assistance.

### Interesting Statistics:

- ◆ 2,201 neighbors served with 939 being new in 2022
- ◆ 6,540 includes all family members of the neighbors fed in 2022
- ◆ 280 families (on average) were served per week in 2022 with a recent week serving 315
- ◆ 14,560 shopping carts were loaded up
- ◆ 72,800 meals provided per shopping cart. This assumes 5 meals can be made with each cart (which is a low number)
- ◆ \$175 assumption of what each cart is worth (again a low number), then...
- ◆ \$2,548,000 was saved by all households through food distribution at KCCFP

Cash donations go a long way. For every dollar donated, the pantry can purchase \$8.00 in food from the Northern Illinois Food Bank. Thank you for your generosity through the year!

### STEWARDSHIP PARISH
