A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

Today's Feast of the Epiphany marks the end of the Church's celebration of Christmas. After today we will once again switch to Ordinary Time (and the color green) until the start of the Season of Lent. There is an ancient tradition in the Church that on the Feast of the Epiphany the dates for the Lenten and Easter Season are read out since their dates change from year to year. In this spirit I want to list out the upcoming feasts and celebrations of the Church Year:

February 14th – Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Season of Lent

March 24th – Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week

March 28th – Holy Thursday

March 29th – Good Friday

March 30th – Holy Saturday

March 31st – Easter Sunday and the beginning of the Season of Easter

May 19th – Pentecost Sunday and the end of the Season of Easter

Having come to the end of the Christmas Season, I want to thank one more time the many people in the parish who volunteered their time to assist in the liturgies during this season. There are a great many ways in which parishioners help and if I forget one of these ways, please forgive me. The Ushers have one of the more difficult volunteer roles during the Christmas Season for they stand in for the entire parish when they greet people who are coming to church. Many of these people are coming to church for the first time in a long time and their impression of the friendliness of the parish are made by the Ushers. The Ushers also have the responsibility of trying to find seats for the people at the 4pm Christmas Eve Mass. The Lectors, the Eucharistic Ministers, and the Altar Servers all have an important role in the Christmas Liturgy which is at the very center of our Catholic faith and our worship and praise of God. The musicians and choir members as well have an important part in our celebration of Christmas. Consider how much of the "Christmas spirit" that we long for and hope to build within us is tied to the music of the Christmas Season. Without music our Christmas celebrations would be lacking in both joy and tradition. Finally, the Arts and Environment Committee did a wonderful job this year in decorating the church for Christmas.

Once again my thanks to everyone who helped out this Christmas Season.

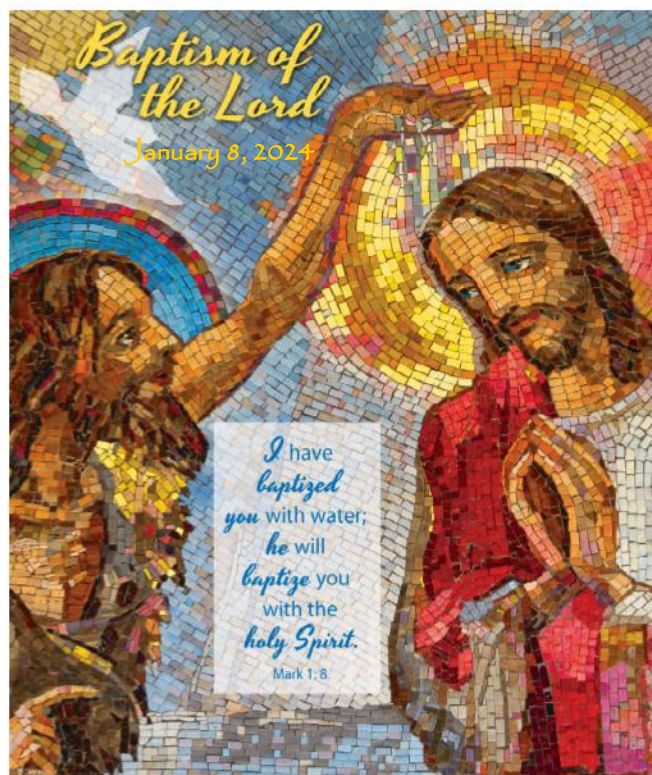
Remember, if we raise more than our goal, the Diocese will return to us 70 percent of the amount over goal. This is an amazing opportunity for our parish.

EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek *epiphainen*, a verb that means "to shine upon," "to manifest," or "to make known." Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11).

TUTOR VOLUNTEERS NEEDED Dominican Literacy Center

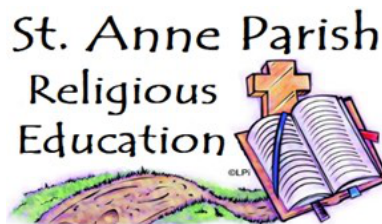
The Dominican Literacy Center in Aurora, celebrating its 30th year, has just received The Best Practices Award from the National Library of Congress. The Center will be training new tutor volunteers for its literacy program in January.

Female volunteers (with high school diploma) are trained to help women students learn to read, write, and speak English. Tutoring sessions are 90 minutes, once a week, from September to May, at 260 Vermont St., Aurora (behind St. Therese Church). Tutors do not need to speak Spanish or have teaching experience, but all volunteers must attend 7 hours of training in addition to viewing several training videos online.

The next training date is Saturday, January 20, from 9:00 AM to 3:30 PM. Tutors will begin with their new student the following week.

KENDALL COUNTY COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

The Kendall County Community Food Pantry continues to serve families from the County in need of food assistance.

Interesting Statistics:

- ◆ 2,201 neighbors served with 939 being new in 2022
- ◆ 6,540 includes all family members of the neighbors fed in 2022
- ◆ 280 families (on average) were served per week in 2022 with a recent week serving 315
- ◆ 14,560 shopping carts were loaded up
- ◆ 72,800 meals provided per shopping cart. This assumes 5 meals can be made with each cart (which is a low number)
- ◆ \$175 assumption of what each cart is worth (again a low number), then...
- ◆ \$2,548,000 was saved by all households through food distribution at KCCFP

Cash donations go a long way. For every dollar donated, the pantry can purchase \$8.00 in food from the Northern Illinois Food Bank.
