A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

The Season of Lent is fast coming to an end. Next Sunday will be Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week which is the most important time of the year for us Christians. There are many things happening in the parish during the upcoming two weeks and I am going to list the highlights for you here:

- You can bring your old palms to the church next weekend for proper disposal. Look for baskets by the front doors to the church.
- Each day of the Triduum (that is Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday) and Easter Sunday is of great importance to the Christian faith. I greatly encourage you to come to as many of the liturgies of Holy Week as possible.
- Holy Thursday:
 - 8am Morning Prayer in the church. Clergy and religious promise to pray what is called the "Liturgy of the Hours" every day as part of their vocation. The Liturgy of the Hours are five separate times (called hours, but more like 5 -15 minutes) of prayer spaced throughout the day that are meant to be the entire day with prayer and praise of God. The Liturgy of the Hours is not restricted to clergy and religious. Indeed, all Christians are encouraged to pray all or some of the hours as their circumstances permit. If you want to see what the Liturgy of the Hours is like, come to Morning Prayer during the Triduum.
 - Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7pm. This is the Mass during which we thank God for the institution of the Holy Eucharistic, the Holy Mass, and the ordained priesthood.
 - Adoration of the Holy Eucharist from the end of Mass until midnight.
- Good Friday:
 - 8am Morning Prayer in the church.
 - Service of the Lord's Passion at 3pm. Although we have communion this is not a Mass. In fact, this is the only day of the entire year in which holding a Mass is forbidden. At this service we recall the suffering and death of Jesus for our salvation. The 3pm time is an ancient tradition that corresponds to the time of the death of our Lord.
 - Stations of the Cross at 7pm.
- Holy Saturday:
 - 8am Morning Prayer in the church.
 - 12.30pm Blessing of Easter Food in the parish hall.
 - 7.30pm Easter Vigil Mass. This is the liturgical high point of the entire Church year, and it is the Mass in which new adult Christians receive the sacraments of Initiation such as Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist.
- Easter Sunday:
 - Masses at 7.30am, 9.15am, and 11am.

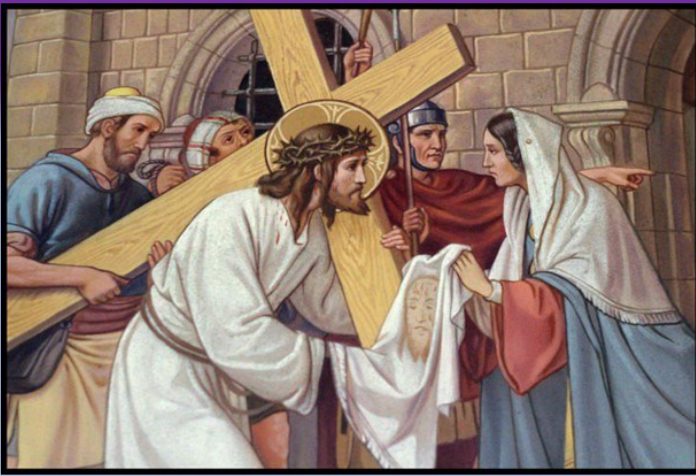

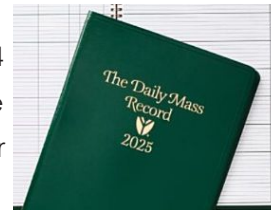

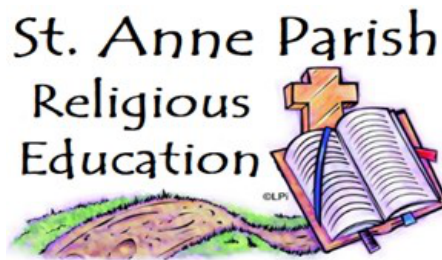

K-5 Family Scripture Connection

One of the possible Gospel stories for this 5th Sunday of Lent is Jesus raising his friend Lazarus from the dead. This story makes me think of TRUST. Martha trusted that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of God, and that those who believe in Him will never die. Jesus trusted that God the Father would hear His prayer and that he had the power to bring Lazarus back to life. We are called to trust that with God, all things are possible. Is there anything in your life causing you to doubt God? What can you do in the remaining weeks of Lent to turn that doubt to trust? When you fully trust God, how will your life be different? How can you help others to trust?

Jesus suffered so that we know that *He knows*, what it is like. He prayed to His Father, as a human, hoping to not experience the pain but still willingly endured it. The next time you struggle, call out to Jesus, and ask for help to make it through your situation. You may still experience hardship, but you aren't alone.

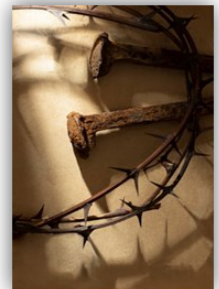

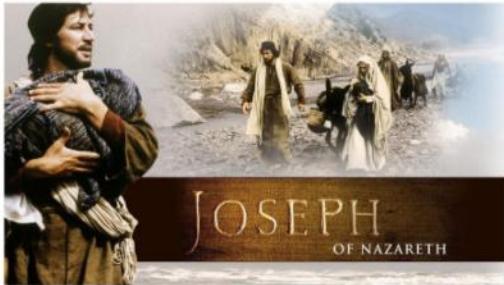

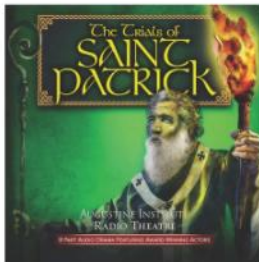

KENDALL COUNTY COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

The Kendall County Community Food Pantry continues to serve families from the County in need of food assistance.

Interesting Statistics:

- ◆ 2,201 neighbors served with 939 being new in 2022
- ◆ 6,540 includes all family members of the neighbors fed in 2022
- ◆ 280 families (on average) were served per week in 2022 with a recent week serving 315
- ◆ 14,560 shopping carts were loaded up
- ◆ 72,800 meals provided per shopping cart. This assumes 5 meals can be made with each cart (which is a low number)
- ◆ \$175 assumption of what each cart is worth (again a low number), then...
- ◆ \$2,548,000 was saved by all households through food distribution at KCCFP

Cash donations go a long way. For every dollar donated, the pantry can purchase \$8.00 in food from the Northern Illinois Food Bank.

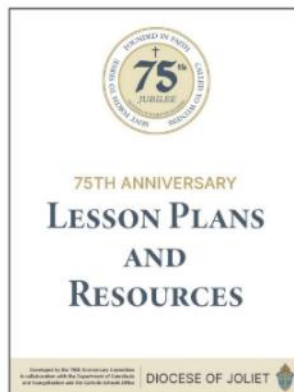

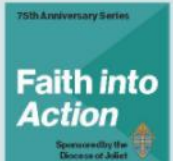

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are generally held the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month (some months this may vary) at 12:30 PM. Expectant parents are to call the Parish Office, six months before the birth of their child for preparation information. **Please do not choose Godparents until you receive the established Church guidelines for Godparents.**

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples seeking the Sacrament of Marriage should call the parish office at least six months before the date of marriage. A wedding date may not be secured until meeting with the parish Deacon or Priest. At that time, the couple will be secured a date and begin the process of preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

If there is anyone at home who cannot get to Mass and the Sacraments because of illness or age, please call the parish office at anytime to request the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.
