## A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

It is a strange oddity that school graduations and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity occur each year around the same time. These two events have a common theme, though you might wonder what these two events have in common. That theme is found in the Gospel reading for today. In today's Gospel Jesus gives to the disciples what is sometimes called the Great Commission. That command to go out into the world and spread the Good News of salvation to all the world in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In a somewhat similar fashion school graduations direct the graduate to go out into the world and use the knowledge they have gained in the service of their lives and their community.

For us as Christians the knowledge we have gained is of the true nature of Almighty God, who is one God in three Persons. This knowledge comes to us from God's own revelation to us and in gaining this knowledge we learn of how we are saved from our sins and how we are sustained in living our lives as children of God. Since this knowledge is a gift to us from God that we must learn about it is important that we in turn pass this knowledge along to others. Hence the Great Commission. Graduates from any school (whether formal or informal) will quickly grasp that the knowledge they have gained is not meant to be hoarded away like a pirate's treasure, but rather put to good use and given out in turn to others. The common theme that links school graduations and today's Solemnity turns out to be the need to share with others the knowledge we have gained throughout our lives.

There are a couple of announcements that I am going to add to today's bulletin article.

The first is that St. Anne Parish will hold a special 24-hour Eucharistic Adoration on June 21-22. This special event will mark the end of the Year of the Eucharistic here in the parish. In a short time, there will be a sign-up asking parishioners to commit to spending one hour with the Holy Eucharist during these days.

The second announcement is that I will be on retreat between June 3-8. There will not be confessions on June 5th. We are still working on getting priests to cover all the normally scheduled Masses that week so please check next week for the daily Mass schedule during June 3-7.

**PEACE & JUSTICE: PRISONER ALERT!**  
**Please Pray for this Persecuted Christian**



- Pastor Anooshavan Avedian was arrested by Iranian security agents on Aug. 21, 2020, at the pastor's home, where he and some Christian friends had gathered for prayer and worship. The group was meeting in his home because Iranian officials had closed their church several years earlier.
- On April 11, 2022, an Iranian judge sentenced Pastor Avedian to 10 years in prison for engaging in "propaganda contrary to and disturbing to the holy religion of Islam." Police ordered Pastor Avedian to appear at Evin prison on Sept. 18, 2023, to begin his 10-year prison sentence.
- In addition to his current prison term, Pastor Avedian faces an additional 10 years for "deprivation of social rights" upon his release. The pastor had appealed to Iran's Supreme Court for a retrial, but the appeal was denied. Pastor Avedian is 61 years old and has a wife and two children.

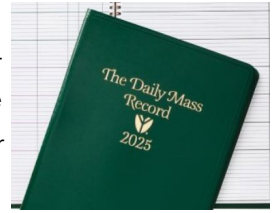
Invite someone to Mass with you. We will be having Hospitality in Anniversary Hall, and the Religious Goods Store will be open.

## KENDALL COUNTY COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

The Kendall County Community Food Pantry continues to serve families from the County in need of food assistance.

### Interesting Statistics:

- ◆ 2,201 neighbors served with 939 being new in 2024
- ◆ 6,540 includes all family members of the neighbors fed in 2024
- ◆ 280 families (on average) were served per week in 2024 with a recent week serving 315
- ◆ 14,560 shopping carts were loaded up
- ◆ 72,800 meals provided per shopping cart. This assumes 5 meals can be made with each cart (which is a low number)
- ◆ \$175 assumption of what each cart is worth (again a low number), then...
- ◆ \$2,548,000 was saved by all households through food distribution at KCCFP

Cash donations go a long way. For every dollar donated, the pantry can purchase \$8.00 in food from the Northern Illinois Food Bank.
