## A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

This will have to be a quick (and short) bulletin article this week so let me focus on several upcoming important events:

First off is the Solemnity of All Saints on Friday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. This is one of my favorite feast days during the entire Church year as it is a wonderful reminder that a person does not have to be famous to be a saint. So often we think that a saint must do or achieve some great public ministry in order to be a saint of God. And it is true that holy men and women who have been in the public eye tend to be the ones who are canonized as saints by the Church. However, the men and women who have been and will be canonized by the Church are not the only saints of God. Those persons who have been canonized are given to us by God for our benefit so that we emulate their faith in Christ and their eagerness to live their lives by His teaching. Yet, simple logic tells us that there must be many holy men and women who by God's grace are saints yet are unknown to us here on Earth. This solemnity is held to honor these unknown saints and to ask them in prayer to aid us with their prayers before God that we might join them in glory one day.

The second important event is the Feast of All Souls on Saturday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>. This feast is held so that we might fulfill an important spiritual act of mercy, namely, praying for the dead. We certainly hope that almighty God will have mercy upon our souls after our death and grant us a place in His kingdom. Yet we also know that our sins have marred our souls so that we would not "fit in" with the saints of God in glory. We need to be purified from the marring effect of sin upon our souls and this purification is called purgatory by the Church. We should recall that all the souls in purgatory are among the saved and will one day take a place amongst the saints and angels in glory. It is part of our Catholic faith that by our prayers here and now we can assist the souls in purgatory in freeing themselves from the effects of their sins and speed them along in reaching the kingdom of God. Surely, helping souls in purgatory in reaching heaven is a great act of mercy.

Finally, and much less importantly, This Sunday, November 3<sup>rd</sup> at 2am is the biannual time change in which the clocks turn back one hour. I know that most of you rely on your smart phones to tell time, and those smart phones turn back the time automatically, so you don't have to worry about waking up at the wrong time. But, for those clocks that are not hooked up to the internet you will have to change them manually. How did we live with changing all those clocks before the internet?

**KENDALL COUNTY COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY**

The Kendall County Community Food Pantry continues to serve families from the County in need of food assistance.

Interesting Statistics:

- ◆ 2,201 neighbors served with 939 being new in 2024
- ◆ 6,540 includes all family members of the neighbors fed in 2024
- ◆ 280 families (on average) were served per week in 2024 with a recent week serving 315
- ◆ 14,560 shopping carts were loaded up
- ◆ 72,800 meals provided per shopping cart. This assumes 5 meals can be made with each cart (which is a low number)
- ◆ \$175 assumption of what each cart is worth (again a low number), then...
- ◆ \$2,548,000 was saved by all households through food distribution at KCCFP

Cash donations go a long way. For every dollar donated, the pantry can purchase \$8.00 in food from the Northern Illinois Food Bank.

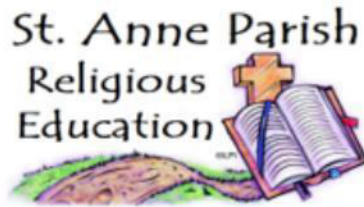


**PRAYER TREE**

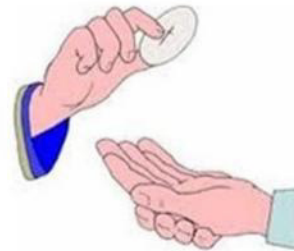

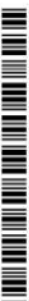

## Importance of the impact a priest can make

I invite you to take a moment and think of a priest who has impacted your life. There may be one or many, and these may be good, bad or both. The truth remains that our lives would be forever different had we not encountered or experienced them. A priest who is well formed, holy, and seeking after the heart of Jesus has the power to radically shape and shift the culture of a parish. They, because of the grace given them by God, release into the world his presence, bring healing, and work miracles in the community they are called to serve. These priests who have been well formed, give hope for the future and in the presence bring about stability because they are firmly rooted in the conviction of the call they have received.

This impact, or as I like to call it, the ripple effect of grace, moves from the Eucharist into the community, our homes and then into the world. I've seen this personally through healing miracles, transformed communities,

vocations to marriage, consecrated life, priesthood, and the mixing of generations as the young and older walk together the life of faith. They say a holy priest forms great people and a great priest good people, etc.



Our church, your family, and your community deserve great and holy priests. This is the work of their seminary education, formation, and their shared experiences with you in the parish community. It is a great joy to watch as the young men see the possible impact they can make on the lives of people around them.

I ask that you take a moment to pray for your parish priest that he would be happy, healthy and holy. Please also pray for the young men in your parish that their hearts would be open to a call to priesthood. Lastly, please pray for our seminarians that they will grow in their love of God and love of the future community they will serve.

*Fr. Steven Borello is a priest of the Diocese of Joliet currently serving as the Director of Vocations.*

*Fr. Steven grew up in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, and is the oldest of 4 children.*

*He attended the University of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana where he studied chemistry and chemical engineering.*

*While there, he received a call to the seminary to discern the priesthood.*

*He received his Bachelors in Theology and Masters of Divinity from Mundelein Seminary and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Joliet in 2011.*

*He first served as an associate pastor at Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills and was then transferred to Saints Peter and Paul Parish in Naperville in June of 2014.*

*In August of 2015, he began serving at St. John Vianney College Seminary as a spiritual director, director of human formation, and instructor to more than 120 men discerning a priestly vocation.*
