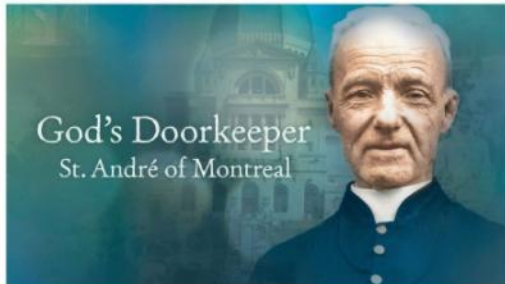

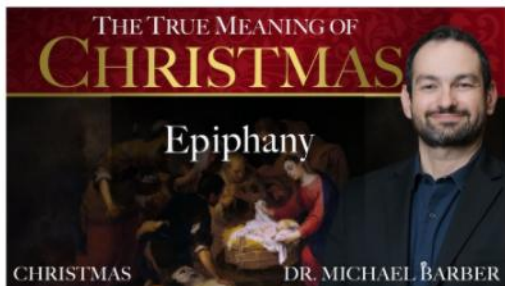

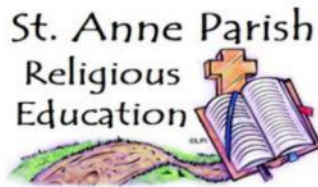


PRAYER TREE
