#### A NOTE FROM FATHER EICKHOFF

I've read that many college professors bemoan the fact that their students are using various Al tools to write their required essays and reports. Sometimes the students do not even bother to try to hide or disguise the fact that they are using Al tools to compose their writing projects. Of course, when an Al tool is being used to compose a report or essay the student's ability or prowess is not being demonstrated. The student is ultimately cheating themselves since they are not actually showing that they understand the assignment or the material that the assignment covers. Their Al generated essays are empty. That is to say that they do not aid the student in mastering the material or truly show the professor that the student understands what is being taught. These essays have the appearance of real knowledge, but not the substance of actual knowledge.

I imagine that many students who use AI tools will say that no one is being harmed by their use of AI tools. That the use of AI tools in composing reports and essays is just there to ease the academic burdens placed upon the student. That the fact that their essay or report does not accurately reflect their own understanding – instead of the AI tool – does not matter. I believe that this line of thought is a dreadful mistake on the student's part. I could go on about how the student is cheating by not doing their own work or how the material that a student may need in the future is not being learned and mastered to the determent of anyone who may be counting upon that student knowing the material in the future. Instead, I will point out how terrible it would be if the Catholic Church were to adopt this attitude in regard to the Holy Eucharist.

At the core of the Mass is the consecration of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Holy Eucharist is then shared out among the worshippers present in the congregation who by consuming the Eucharist not only fulfill the Gospel command to eat His flesh and drink His Blood but also receive from the Eucharist the very help from God that we need to flourish in this life. Imagine then what would happen if the Holy Eucharist were not actually the Body and Blood of our Lord. In that case, the Eucharist would be empty - or at least greatly deficient - of meaning and potency. There would not be the actual presence of Jesus Christ; there would not be the fulness of grace working within the Sacrament; there would not be the potential for true union with God or understanding of Christ. It would be like a student's AI written essay in which there is the appearance of understanding and knowledge, but that appearance is all that there is and not the substance. How fortunate for us that AI has not invaded the Mass and that we have the reality of the Eucharist and not only the appearance.







#### FAQ's about RE/DASH

Do I have to be a parishioner to enroll my child in RE? Yes. You can register your family in St. Anne Parish via the "Newcomers" link on the parish website.

When should I enroll my child for First Communion? Preparation for First Reconciliation and Communion is a two-year program. Parents should enroll their child in 1st grade if they wish for their child to receive the sacraments in 2nd grade. Older students must participate in two years of preparation as well.

When can my teen prepare for Confirmation? Preparation for Confirmation is a three-year program called D.A.S.H. Students *typically* begin DASH 1 in their 6th grade year, attend a retreat in the summer after their 8th grade year (DASH 3), and receive the sacrament in the fall of their freshman year. *But*, students can come at different grades in JH (or even as a Freshman in high school) and we create a plan so teens can do all the work and be closer in age with their peers.

How much is tuition? Early Bird (thru July 31): \$160 for 1 child; \$235 for 2 children; \$280 for 3+ children. Starting August 1st is regular rate: \$200 for 1 child; \$275 for 2 children; \$320 for 3+ children. \$40 fee per child for sacraments. After we buy books in mid-August, we add an additional \$20 to your total.

Do you need volunteers? YES! We need lead catechists, aides, hallway monitors, and SPICE (special education) teachers. Volunteers receive a discount on their tuition. Contact Cathy or Julie for more information.

Do you say any special prayers during the Consecration at Mass or when you receive Jesus in the Eucharist?




Have you ever been to Adoration? What was it like? Describe it to younger siblings, and talk with your family about how you can work together to visit Jesus in the Eucharist this week.

A wedding date may not be secured until meeting with the parish Deacon or Priest. At that time, the couple will be secured a date and begin the process of preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage.


